- 1. **Regarding Dual Enrollment:** Yes, we still will be having Dual enrollment in the fall. We will not be having the May 6th meeting to MCC, so this is what I need each of you to do that will be new to the Dual Enrollment process:
 - Each of you can start the process by doing the online application for Dual enrollment through this link:

 https://www.montcalm.edu/search?query=dual+enrollment once you complete this process, you will receive an email with directions as to your next steps. Please remember that MCC is closed and I am not sure if they are working from home, so this process may take some time. You will need to establish your MCC email and complete the online orientation. As far as the accuplacer testing, it has not yet been decided how that will be handled. I will update you as soon as I know. If the above link does not work,
 - When everything has been completed, you will need to fill out and complete the class registration form: https://www.montcalm.edu/media/2147/dual-enrollment-handbook-form.pdf and return it to me via email to me. The classes that are offered for Juniors at CMHS in the fall will be Psychology 120 (for all) and English 100 (for Seniors). The Spring we will offer Sociology 230(for all) and English 101 (for Seniors). If you sign up for a class (or classes), if you take 1 class lets say Psych 120, that will fill in for your 5th and 6th hours in your schedule. If you are a Senior and are choosing to take both Psych 120 and Eng 100, then they will fill in for your 4th, 5th & 6th hours in your schedule. (or if in band, 5th & 6th and one other slot)
 - Once you have all the above steps completed, in August you will go to MCC's Bookstore to get your books. If possible, buy used, that way you have a better chance of not going over the allotment that is allowed per course. If you go over the allotment, then you will be required to pay the additional cost. Books are to be returned to me at the end of the semester so I may in turn give them to the next students that may need them.
 - To search for classes at MCC go to https://my.montcalm.edu/ics and scroll down on the right side of the page, search and register for classes. First drop down you will choose Fall 2020 and 2nd drop down you will choose the class, for example, communication. Do not choose anything else and scroll down to the bottom and hit submit, that way it brings up all available classes. If you have a question as to a class you can take, please email to discuss options.
 - One thing to remember!!!! **IF YOU FAIL OR WITHRAW** the course, you are required to pay back CMHS.

- **Juniors** who are returning to Dual enrollment, you will **not** need to reapply, you will **just need to complete the registration form** in the link above and return back to me. If you have any questions, please get a hold of me!
